A few years ago I received a large flyer from Joyce Meyer Ministries. It was a colorful poster advertising a Women's Convention in St. Louis, and what caught my eye (besides the cool graphics and slick layout) was the theme of the Convention spelled out in large block letters: "PURPOSE AND PASSION." Beneath that slogan was the catchy phrase "It's time to start showing the rest of the world how elegant and beautiful godly women should live—full of PURPOSE and overflowing with PASSION!" The whole piece was so well done that I too wanted to attend--but apparently Joyce must have realized the power of her poster, for in small print at the bottom it said "this is a women's convention, therefore we are unable to accommodate men or children." No fair!

Yet even though I missed Joyce's Women's Convention, I haven't missed out on the opportunity to give some thought to its theme and slogan. Purpose and passion have become synonymous with living a full and fulfilling life, and to be suspected of being without them is tantamount to social leprosy. Yet it is important to ask ourselves: what is the source of our purpose and passion...and in what ways are we channeling it in the world?

Surely no one would accuse Adolf Hitler or ISIS of having a lack of purpose and passion, and the world is all too well acquainted with the results of their particular forms of enthusiasm. But what about us? What opens us to a greater sense of purpose? What unleashes our passion? Our work, our vocations? Our families; our friends; our pets? Our "stuff?" Our political views? Our interests and hobbies? Our ambitions?

How about our connection to God? Our walk of discipleship? Our church?

It's not enough to simply have passion and purpose, as wonderful as it is to feel enthusiastic and "alive." What we ground our passion and purpose in is what truly matters. As Christians, we are called to ground our purpose and passion in the Gospel, the Good News we have received about our lives through the teachings and life of Jesus Christ. As we do that, we are promised a new spirit of truth, purpose, and passion that will make us new, vital, and power-filled. I assume that is the purpose and passion Joyce was hoping to have women connect with at her annual Women's Convention.

But sadly, the world is absolutely filled with misdirected purposes and passion, even among Christians...and history and current events amply demonstrate that if we do not find our purpose and passion in the values found in the Gospel, we will find our purpose and passion somewhere else. What is amazing to me is that God, who seeks to be the source of our greatest purpose and passion, will not take from us our freedom to seek our purpose and passion in every conceivable half-God, even when it brings misery and suffering on a global scale. This is a very sobering truth...and a sobering reminder of our responsibility to carefully choose our deepest purposes and our greatest passions.

Friends, as the summer winds down and the busyness of our fall schedules shortly resume, I urge you to take time to examine where your purpose and passion lie. Consider your life: what is revealed by it, and who is helped by it. Consider your heroes, and the voices you are most attentive to. Most of all, consider your relationship to God, and seek to strengthen that relationship. If you do that, then you, as Joyce's poster suggests, will show the rest of the world how elegant and beautiful people LIKE YOU live lives full of PURPOSE that overflow with PASSION. And what a blessing that would be--to you; to the world; and to God! --Pastor Craig
