***“For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother’s womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”*** –Psalm 139: 13-14

There are two roles in life I would never want: one is being God; the other is being a mother--and if I had to choose between those two, my last choice would be a mother! Now part of the reason for that is because I have a weak stomach for childbirth—I doubt that I could make it through a birth as an observer, much less a participant (ask Vicki about that). But the deeper reason is that I don’t know how mothers can bring a new life into the world that has come from their life, and then literally and metaphorically cut the cord and separate their life from the life of their child. Now I know that fathers play a role in procreation, but no man has a womb; no man has a life grow in him, flesh of flesh, bone of bone. We men supply half the DNA, the pattern of life--but mothers supply all the building materials that make the pattern live!

I am amazed at the great unselfishness that is at the heart of motherhood—a great unselfishness that says *“You will always be part of me, and I have a great love for you that will last as long as I last...but I do not own you, I cannot control you, and I cannot walk your path for you.”* And that is the heart of why I would not want to be a mother. Mothers give their all to be a mother, only to begin the lifelong process of letting go. That to me is asking a lot from a human being--it sounds like mothers are being asked to be like God! And yet that makes sense, for God is very much like a mother:

**God creates life--like a mother.**

**God forms us, knits us together in the womb--like a mother.**

**God loves us unconditionally—like a mother.**

**God yearns to protect and nurture us, so we grow healthy and whole--like a mother.**

**And God never forgets us, even when we forget God-- like a mother.**

The difference is that God is...God. God has unlimited power, unlimited wisdom, and unlimited grace to deal with God’s children: to both love them and let them go; to hold them and yet give them freedom; to wish for the best for them and yet not be destroyed when the worst happens to them...or when the worst happens *because of them*. It seems almost unfair that God would give to mortal women such a divine task as motherhood, and yet God has seen fit to share God’s joys and God’s challenges as “Parent” with mothers!

Mothers have always had a blessed but difficult calling, and they surely need our prayers—and many of them! And Mothers, never forget that in this sacred, exhausting, exhilarating and heartbreaking work you have never been alone, and you will never be alone! For your eternal Parent, God—the “Father” who seems an awful lot like a mother—has always been, and will always be, with you: to strengthen you, to give you wisdom, to comfort you, and share your laughter and your tears.

May that Good News help all mothers “keep the faith” as they mother the next generation of US—the wonderful, wayward, humorous and heartbreaking children of God *and* Eve! Happy Mothers’ Day to all mothers—everywhere! --Pastor Craig



The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by the Moderator, Donna Ryherd. Pastor Craig gave a devotional by Ruth Land. The March Cabinet minutes were approved as read. **Worship:** The board did not meet in March. The next scheduled meeting is April 12<sup>th</sup>. **Evangelism:** Only a few comments

were received about the Annual Picnic. **Christian Ed.:** They met 4 weeks ago; talked about the Easter breakfast and the Easter egg hunt. The ORFF instruments will not be lent out due to the high replacement costs. Next meeting will be tomorrow. **Treasurer:** The report is at the end of the minutes. Tracy moved and Al seconded to put the report to audit. **Mission:** Verna Bierle is putting the D/SAOC basket together which has \$669.00 in gift cards. OGHS donations of \$163.00. Backpacks will be filled on the 25<sup>th</sup> of April. The Ice Cream Social is tentatively scheduled for June 13, 2018 at Faith United Methodist Church. **Women's Fellowship:** Karin thanked those who helped with the Lenten luncheon and the program. The Thrift sale is scheduled for April 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. (Note: Thrift Sale was rescheduled to May 18 & 19.) May birthdays at Crestview and Southfield will be celebrated on May 3<sup>rd</sup>. The men will be preparing the May dinner scheduled for May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Kay provided a list of options for next year's re-organization to be taken to our circle members. Next meeting is May 2<sup>nd</sup>. **Trustees:** Al mentioned that Sherry Leksell and Kolleen Taylor are writing the letter of intent for the stained-glass window grant which is due in April. **Staff Parish:** Stephanie reported a few issues raised earlier in the year and will meet with the committee members to discuss in detail. **Pastor's Report:** Craig reported on 2 upcoming weddings – one for Katie Holdgrafer on May 5<sup>th</sup>. Discussed the items we needed to document: Evidence of history of community service, Any previous work done on windows, Plan for upkeep, Bids, Fundraising, Detailed description of scope of work, Costs. We will meet Sunday after church to get copies of contract and other proposals.

Kolleen and Sherry will work on the letter and get it sent in by April 1, 2018. Karin and Audrey are working on the church's mission list. Children's chairs Approved, Package of 6, Multi colored, Legs with swivel glides, Around \$146, Joyce will order.

#### **Trustees Minutes**

It had been brought to Trustees attention from the Christian Ed Committee that Kolleen Taylor wants to take the ORFF instruments to the Library in Story City. They are expensive instruments and there would be no way to transport them safely. Tracy did leave us information on the cost of the instruments and it did confirm the price of them. A motion was made that the church will not loan out the ORFF instruments to anyone, by Tom. It was seconded by Sherry. It was approved. We were updated on the grant. Kolleen and Sherry have started the letter for the grant. We thought it was due on April 1, but it is not due until April 15. Once the letter is finished it will be reviewed by the Trustees.

#### **Trustees Minutes**

Update on the lots. Stacy said there are still two interested parties when spring gets here. There have not been any more stained-glass window donations. The Fire alarm sensitivity check was cancelled 3-15-18. Inspection is due in July. We will investigate disconnecting the alarms later. Mark Trueblood fixed the toilet flap in the fellowship hall bathroom. Grants: Sherry and Donna are working on the letter of intent, with Kolleen's help. Want to get both letters out before April 17. Want to add Emergency Shelter to the list of community activities in the letter. Tracy will check to see when Scott Jaycox will be finishing the work in the elevator shaft. The speakers are now working in the nursery. Tom will check with Mark Trueblood on flushing the valves on the boiler.

New Business

Al will represent the Trustees at the April Cabinet meeting. Boilers were inspected 3-20-18. Report went to state. Doors for the storage area in the west entry will be checked by Al and Tom.

### **Pastor's Report to Cabinet**

Worship: Our Maundy Thursday service was held in the East Chapel on Thursday, March 29, beginning at 7 pm, with communion, a choral anthem, and a service of Tenebrae. Easter service was held at 10:30 am, following the Easter breakfast beginning at 9:30 am and children's Easter activities in the lower level of the church. On April 8 the KLAB kids will play the ORFF instruments in worship, and April 29<sup>th</sup> we lead the Care Center worship services in town.

Weddings: I will preside at the wedding renewal ceremony of Baily Fogle Roderick in Grinnell on Saturday, April 28. Bailey has been married for 2(?) years now but wants to renew her vows in a Christian church. Katie Holdgrafer and Mason McCarville will be married in our sanctuary on Saturday, May 5<sup>th</sup> at 4 pm. The wedding rehearsal will be held in our sanctuary at 6 pm on Friday, May 4<sup>th</sup>.

Funerals: I was asked to officiate at 2 non-member funerals in the last month: Ray Bringolf (March 17) and Diana Baker (March 26). Both were held at Foster's Funeral home.

KLAB: We are nearing the end of our program before summer recess! We met March 28 as one group to review the Easter story and make Easter Centerpieces. Ann Sherve-Ose worked with the KLAB kids on April 4, preparing them for an ORFF musical offering on Sunday, April 8. Ye Olde KLAB Gang made Easter cards to mail, and they will be working on sewing pillowcases for the Beacon of Hope. On April 18 we will show our "love of creation" by picking up trash along the Boone River trail near the north boat landing, and May 2 will be our last KLAB session before summer—and our annual trip to the DQ!

Adult Education: We have discussed the atonement and Easter, and will continue with the Hidden Histories of the UCC.

WCMA: We continue to organize a city-wide food packing event for Kids against Hunger, but the initial date we wanted (November 18 at Fuller hall) was already taken, and a new date has not been selected. A fundraising chicken dinner for the Pentecostal church will be held on Sunday April 22, 11-1 pm at the WC Middle School. The Summer lunch program will again happen in WC this year, but no details are available yet. VBS dates: Asbury UMC: July 9-13, 1-4 pm. Trinity ELCA: June 25-28 (no time announced) St. Paul Lutheran: June 11-15, 9-11:30 am. Pastor Michael Slininger of Faith UMC announced that he will be moving to a new pastorate, and will begin his ministry there in June of 2018.

Stephen Ministry: We currently have 4 Stephen Ministers matched with care receivers. We met April 5 for our monthly 2 hour session, hearing check-ins and studying the topic of caring for those experiencing divorce.

NW Committee on Ministry: The date for the NW association Annual meeting will be May 5, to be held at Mayflower UCC in Sioux City. I still have no other details to report. I will be attending a CoM training event in Sioux Falls, South Dakota April 20-21 with Dale Olson, Marjorie Groves, and Joyce Gelhaus. We are in the process of trying to schedule a PSC with Diane Friedericks and the churches in Belmond and Klemme. Our Sacred Space (Pilgrim Heights) is holding a "Earth" Day of Discovery on Saturday, April 21, 2018, from 1-4:30 pm. This event is to help youth and adults get acquainted with Pilgrim Heights.

### **Evangelism Board**

**Greeters and Ushers:** We have compiled a list of members we believe are willing and able to usher. We have attempted to create Usher Teams – 3 or 4 people who might normally sit together, are family, or perhaps they serve on a circle together. We hope we can fill the weeks ahead with these “teams” and they create a year-long schedule by rotating the teams. If it works we would be asking our congregation to step up to usher every 10 weeks or so. That said, we are always in need of volunteers to fill the role of Greeters and Ushers on Sunday mornings. Please volunteer early ... or late for that matter! If you arrive on Sunday morning and see the need we always welcome the offer to help!

**Welcome bags (adults) and Activity Bags (youth):** Wilma continues to refill and refresh supply our Welcome Bags, sometimes using materials to fit the season, and always to ensure a sweet treat inside. Dawn maintains our Activity Bags for the youth, keeping them cleaned and well stocked.

**Misc:** Last month we discussed the repeated cancellation of our Annual Picnic. The question was presented to Cabinet and was published in the monthly church letter. To date we have very little feedback, but will continue to keep the topic open for discussion.
