"Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." –Eph. 5:1

Do you have any plans for Lent? I'm guessing the minister will be the only person who asks you that question, so I'm glad I did.

So...do you have any plans for Lent?

Now make no mistake—Lent comes with its own plans starting with Ash Wednesday, when we consciously claim our mortality (*from dust you came and to dust you shall return*), a deeply disruptive thought that is meant to focus our minds and hearts on what is most important in life. Then there is Holy Week, which begins with the waving of palms and ends with drama, blood, tears, and a sealed tomb. But during the 40 days or so of Lent there is plenty of time for you to execute your plan *if you take the time and set the intention to make one*. You could choose to study scripture daily, or commit to a deeper prayer life. You might decide you want to put your faith into action and seek to serve others in a more committed way. And of course there is the old standby: you could give up something for Lent, preferably something you will miss—your "sacrifice" drawing you closer to Jesus' supreme sacrifice on the cross. (One of my neighbors once told me he was giving up "his" Sundays for Lent, and he faithfully attended church on Sundays until after Easter)

If you haven't made any plans yet, here's one: Spend 40 days meditating on "LOVE." Wrestle with questions like:

- What is love, really? Is it sentiment? Passion? An exchange? What types of love am I experiencing in my life?
- Am I truly loving, or am I fooling myself? Is my "love" just a cover for other emotions and needs? What needs to be healed in me so that I may experience and share greater love? Do I believe that I am even capable of love—or being loved?
- Who am I NOT to love? (this is a tough one) We know that what made Jesus' life distinct was his decision to love all people--and not just "love" them but also act from that love in all of his dealings with them. And yet we know that we all have internal lists of people we resist loving because they are different, or threatening, or revolting, or simply do not fit in with our agendas or preferences. Ask God to teach you about divine love this Lent! But be mindful that love is a Pandora's Box, and once you open yourself to love you may, like Jesus, lose yourself to love.
- And the biggie: Why am I so afraid of love? Because of my past? Because I'm afraid of being hurt? Because I believe deep down that it will not save me but destroy me...because love only weakens, while hate strengthens? Go deep into this one question and ask yourself: Why am I afraid of God's love?

As you can see, there really is a LOT to meditate on and wrestle with when it comes to love. What is ironic is that Christianity is a religion of love, and yet it has historically been filled with so much that is not born of love! We all can see the fruits of the sorrowing loss of love in our current culture, and even we Christians are double-minded about love and suspicious of its demands and power. And yet we will not reach the heart of this faith, nor will we find *salvation* as healing and unity with God without giving ourselves totally over to love, as did Jesus. That is why this seemingly fluffy Lenten plan may be the most life-changing 6 weeks you will undergo!

I continue to be haunted by this thought taken from the book *A Course in Miracles*, from the chapter entitled "The Fear of Redemption:" ... But exempt no one from your love, or you will be hiding a dark place in your mind where the Holy Spirit is not welcome. And thus you will exempt

yourself from His healing power, for by not offering total love you will not be healed completely. Healing must be as complete as fear, for love cannot enter where there is one spot of fear to mar its welcome.

Friends, if we should give up one thing this Lenten season let it be our fear of LOVE....and everything else we cling to so that LOVE is not the centerpiece of our lives. If we will do this, surely we will know the Master's heart and the very Mind of God, and we will know from what, and *for* what, we came into being as the lovely thoughts of God's loving Mind. —Pastor Craig

First Congregational will begin the observance of Lent with an Ash Wednesday Service on Wednesday, March 6, beginning at 7 p.m. in the East Chapel. Ash Wednesday is a day of penitence and preparation which begins our Lenten season; it is a day which reminds us of our mortality, and our need for repentance and renewal. We will observe Ash Wednesday with the Imposition of Ashes and share the sacrament of Holy Communion by intinction.

# **Adult Education Class** What Wondrous Love: Holy Week in Word and Art

During the season of Lent our Adult Education Class will frame our studies around the great themes of Holy Week using the resource from the Chandler School of Theology entitled "What Wondrous Love: Holy Week in Word and Art." This DVD-based study uses the artwork of John August Swanson and video commentaries by academic scholars to study the stories of Holy Week and Easter. The major themes we will discuss are: "Power and Triumph" (Palm Sunday) "Enlightenment through Service" (the Footwashing) "Meeting God in a Meal" (the Last Supper) "Fear's Power" (the Betrayal and Arrest) "Sin and Suffering" (The Crucifixion) "Resurrection and Life" (The raising of Lazarus and Easter) Join us at 9:15 am in the Multipurpose Room as we explore our faith and

its vital intersections with the central themes of human life. There will be plenty to discuss!
