"I have called you friends, for I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father."—John 15:15

Do you have many friends? Just about everyone knows Vicki and I have 4 furry friends at home, and there is a reason they are called a human's best friend! Whenever I leave they seem sorry to see me go, and when I come home they ALWAYS greet me at the door with wagging tails and big dog smiles. When Vicki or I are feeling down they sense our mood and try to comfort us, or at least stay with us in solidarity. When we go somewhere—even to the landfill—they are game to ride along, for the single biggest pleasure of their life is our company. Now that's a friend!

Did you have a best friend when you were young? Bob and Steve Green were my best friends growing up. We rode bikes together, played ball together, built models together and listened to KISS albums together, detassled together, and camped out in the back yard together. We were inseparable—the original band of brothers.

Do you have a lifelong friend? A resident of Southfield once shared with me that he had such a friend. They grew up on neighboring farms, and all through their adult lives they coffeed together, dined out and socialized together...and when Bill had a stroke and had to go to Southfield because of his disability, his friend was there to regularly visit him and keep their friendship alive. Now that's a friend!

Dr. Tim Keller once said the marks of a true friend are the 4 C's: Constancy, Carefulness, Candor, and Counsel. Do you have a friend like that? Wouldn't it be wonderful if we all did?

I have such a friend....let me tell you about him.

My friend was brought up in a poor household, and yet he has always been rich in spirit.

He has an instinct about how to be a good friend, for it comes naturally to him.

He has always helped those in need, and he always seeks out the lonely ones, the ones who are left out, in order to befriend them. He always welcomes everyone into his circle--even those "unwelcomed" by others.

He has always been willing to share what he has with his friends.

He has a reputation for sometimes being blunt (candor), and sometimes he can be uncomfortably honest in his advice (counsel), but even when he's being candid and honest you know he is doing it because he cares about you and wants to help you (carefulness).

But it is his constancy that is the most remarkable thing about his friendship, for although he knows you warts and all, he still loves you and wants to be your friend! And even toward those who have betrayed him he holds no malice, for he stands constant in his offer of forgiveness and friendship. Now that's a friend!

And what does a friend want from me besides my friendship? He wants me to follow his lead and extend my circle of friendship as he does: beyond my circle of birth, beyond my circle of like-mindedness, beyond my circle of proximity, beyond my circle of comfort, beyond my circle of "mutuality." For my friend knows what makes my life—and every human life-- a heaven or a hell is *how far we are willing to extend our gift of friendship to others.*

I don't have to tell you that in this polarized, mistrustful and frightened world we stand more and more isolated and alienated from one another, causing our friendships and our peace to suffer because of this. But when I become too withdrawn and forlorn my friend reminds me that we were created for one another, and He assures me that much strength and peace are to be found in our forged bonds of friendship that are grounded in the fruits of love.

As the summer months begin there will be plenty of opportunities for each of us to meet new people and make new friends! And so my prayer is simple:

May we all take to heart the importance and the blessings of having a friend like Jesus,

And may we all strive to be such a friend to others! -- Pastor Craig

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by the Moderator, Nate Lahr. Pastor Craig opened the meeting with a devotional 'Make a Joyful Noise' and a prayer. The minutes of the April cabinet meeting were read. Laurie Epps moved and Gretchen McGlynn seconded that the minutes be approved as read. The motion passed.

BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS: Christian Education: The discussion of whether to keep doing Sunday school continues. It was suggested that a 'one room school house' be tried instead of trying to divide into grades. No decision made yet. Evangelism: The Evangelism Board met and officers were selected. Kay Harfst is chair. Ushers need reminded to hand out welcome packets to visitors. Plans for a Summer Potluck on July 20 will include a cooking contest. Finance: This board met late April and officers were selected. Mission: The clean-up of the Brewer Creek Trail around the hospital was held April 19th and was successful. The next clean-up will be the gulley by Bomgaars on May 16th at 4 pm. The Backpack packing on April 23rd at Trinity was also well attended. Relay for Life is set for June 19th in Stanhope from 6 to 9pm. A sign-up sheet is out. The Ice Cream Social will be held June 12th at UCC. Also the Beacon of Hope meal will be served on May 28th. Staff/Parish: We have no issues so far this year therefore nothing to report. Trustees: The paper towel dispenser has been fixed or ordered. The Freeman Journal newspaper has been stopped. The Pentecostal church on Division and Seneca has asked and received permission to hold Sunday services in our sanctuary from 12:30 – 4:30pm for the next 6 weeks while their building undergoes repairs. They have insurance and will pay \$75.00 a week. Worship Board: For Sundays that Pastor Craig is absent, video services will be used. Worship Board will serve coffee after worship on May 19th. Women's Fellowship: There will be no May dinner this year. Instead, a evening Dessert

Event will be held on May 15th at which time the distribution of funds will be revealed. Some recipients are ACE - \$500.00; Tri-Conference Disaster Relief Fund-\$500.00; Kendall Young Library - \$500.00; Almost Home-\$300.00. Others are the Agape fund, swim passes, Crime Stoppers et al. **Pastor's Report:** The School Lunch program needs more servers to volunteer than in prior years because only 1 cook was hired this year. Sign-up sheets are out. **Treasurer:** April offerings were down and expenses were up. The breakdown for the first 1/3 of the year shows everything is under budget. Tracy Wehrhan moved to put the report to audit. Dale Olson seconded. The report was put to audit.

PENDING BUSINESS:

A delegate is need for the Tri-Conference annual meeting with Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota to be held June 14-16 in Omaha. The church will pay the \$135.00 registration fee. An email from Nate Lahr, the moderator requesting a volunteer will be sent.

Worship Board Worship board is serving coffee Sunday, May 19th. Working on special music for Saturday evening service and Sunday summer worship service. Finalize plans for communion May 5th. Suggestions were discussed for Mother's Day and Father's Day recognition.

Finance Board Duane volunteered to be chairman and Tracy volunteered to be secretary. Tracy and Dale gave financial report concerning income and expenses. Scholarships were discussed. Michele has already put the announcement in the bulletin and will be in the next two newsletters. Applications are due to the Finance Board on June 15. The tentative date to hand out scholarships is set for Saturday, July 20th if this is agreeable with Pastor Craig and the Worship Board. Distribution of the AGAPE fund was discussed. With the future of the Evangelism board in question, the Finance board agreed to manage disbursements for this fund. The applicant is to make their request to the Pastor and the Pastor will forward the request to all finance board members via email. The email is to include the applicant's name, amount requested and what the monies are to be used for. Once the Pastor receives a positive response from three(3) of the board members, the request will be granted. Christian Education Old business was a discussion of Confirmation and Easter activities. The Confirmation service went well. There will be no Confirmation class next year. There has been interest in this year's confirmands to take a mission trip within the United States for 2020, including working to finance it with itinerary yet undecided. Easter egg activities included approximately 20 children and Pastor Craig handed out 19 chocolate crosses after the service. On May 5 there will be both Graduation and Promotion. In addition to the cake, plates, napkins and nuts already purchased, Laurie will get juice and Jane will purchase bananas, apples and cuties. Pastor Craig would like rosters and pictures from Sunday School and KLAB for Promotion Sunday. He and Vickie will be responsible for the gifts presented. New business included a review of upcoming events in KLAB (Dairy Queen and lock-in) and a possible continuation of pen pal letters with Crestview over the summer, perhaps one Sunday a month. Following that, there was a discussion of the future of KLAB and Sunday School. Various views were expressed including: difficulty in recruiting teachers and students, numbers of students fluctuate- not allowing teachers to plan (or to plan and no one is there), classes during church are not fair for the teachers, lack of students past 7th or 8th grade, liability in offering rides to students, family classes of Sunday School. It was decided to try a "one room schoolhouse" approach with Laurie Epps being the main teacher for all levels and Jill and Karinne helping out. A cycle of teachers will be used to have one class room where older students can help the younger ones. KLAB will focus on a theme of "giving back", picking up trash, helping others, pen pals. Youth fellowship will be their goal since formal lessons after a full day at school are very difficult. Evangelism Board We reviewed the constitutional responsibilities of the Evangelism Board to familiarize new members with board requirements. Kay agreed to be chair after Carol accepted the Cabinet representative post. Leah will act as recording secretary. Wilma will hopefully continue sending cards. It was brought up that ushers need to be reminded to recognize visitors and offer them

As recognition of our roles to evangelize, we will host a Summer Potluck following the July 20 Saturday Service. There was a presentation by UCC Global Ministries partner Kearstin Bailey, who was a Global Missions Intern over the past two years in Greece. Tri State Annual Meeting Iowa-Nebraska-South Dakota United Church of Christ will be held June 14, 3 p.m. - June 16, 10:30 a.m. at the Tri-Faith Initiative, Omaha, NE. The cost is \$135 (includes Friday reception & dinner, Friday Awards Luncheon, Saturday Banquet) We will need a delegate(s) to attend this meeting, as it replaces the Iowa Conference annual meeting. I am electing not to attend as I will be attending General Synod the following week. I have been selected to be a voting delegate representing our Tri-Conference at the UCC General Synod which will be held in Milwaukee, WI. General Synod is the national decision-making body for the denomination, responsible for giving general direction to the evangelistic, missionary, and justice programs of the UCC. General Synods convene every 2 years; this one runs from June 21-June 25. Since I have never attended a General Synod I am looking forward to learning more about our justice and mission commitments and seeing our deliberative processes firsthand!
