"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." --1 John 4:7,8,16b

This newsletter article is an adaptation from the sermon I preached on Saturday, August 27.

Have you ever heard the Good News that "God loves you?" Of course you have! Now let me ask a harder question: When is the last time you actually felt the love of God?

That can be much harder question to answer, can't it? Maybe you've never really felt the love of God!

Or maybe you have...but it has come to you in "indirect" ways as tangible expressions of God's love, rather than a direct experience of God's love itself. Perhaps you were in great need, and you prayed for help, and God answered your prayer...and in that answer you realized that God loves you.

Or perhaps you were moved deeply by some song or piece of music, or you were touched by a sunset or a walk in the woods and you were overcome by the sheer beauty of the moment, and you were thankful to be alive...and in that moment you realized that God loves you. Experiencing the love of God indirectly through God's loving acts is certainly a good thing!

Or perhaps you have experienced God's love indirectly through the love of another. The 1st epistle of John certainly ties our human love to God's love that lives in us and is expressed through our love.

But I want to return to my original question: when is the last time you actually felt the love of God—directly. Is that even possible?

My answer would be yes, it is possible. If there is a God, and if our faith tradition is correct about the character and nature of God, then yes, it is possible to feel God's love directly; without mediation of any kind.

So if you have ever felt the love of God directly, when did you feel it last? Has it been a while? Has it been a long while?

I think it is pretty obvious we humans collectively haven't been feeling the direct love of God very much, or the world wouldn't look and feel the way it does. And on a personal note, it has been a while since I have felt that love as well. Earlier this week I was feeling pretty emotionally churned up, and in a moment of clarity I realized that if I would only open myself to God and completely surrender to God—much like jumping in the ocean and not even trying to stay afloat—I would find the peace I was missing!

But much like jumping into the ocean and not even trying to stay afloat...my instincts held me back. I have spoken more than once about our deep, almost instinctual and subconscious fear of surrendering to God because we fear we will be lost, and again that feeling was very present when I leaned into surrendering to God. I just couldn't do it, which brought an ache to my heart...

But also a greater appreciation of how it is that something as natural and life-giving as opening ourselves to God and experiencing God's love directly...is such a rarity for our species.

Then I stumbled across this quote from pastor Fred Beuchner, who once wrote this: "The Final Secret, I think, is this: that the words 'You shall love the Lord your God' become in the end, less a command, than a promise."

Think about that quote for a moment. Fred is telling us that there will come a day when we will have the courage, the wisdom, and the deep desire to stop fighting against God, stop fearing God, stop postponing the inevitable and just surrender to God and let God in completely, holding nothing back...and in that moment of surrender we shall know God's love, directly and totally; we will know

the love that is in us, directly and totally; and we will do the most natural thing, the most compelling thing, the most needful thing in our lives:

we will join our lives to God's cosmic life,

we will align our minds to God's cosmic mind,

and our hearts will be filled with all the deep feelings of God's cosmic heart!

For we will at last know our destiny and purpose in this life: to stop fighting God and return to God, and then live our lives out of this life-transforming revelation. To my mind THIS is the human species' alpha and omega; this is our goal and highest good! Yet what is ironic is that as adults we make such an ordeal out of this, yet children do it all the time, naturally and effortlessly. Haven't you noticed how children can play in the sunshine and let the cosmic goodwill that is all around them fill their souls? You know this is true because you can hear it in their laughter, and see it in their shining smiles! Can you remember that feeling of childhood when all of Life felt like it was a gift, and all was well, and the very sky and earth radiated wellbeing and love to you?

And yet as we grow older we lose that ability to surrender and allow God's love to flow in, and our love to flow out. Somewhere along the way we became afraid of that feeling...even as we have become afraid of just about everything else.

We become afraid of God, and our traditions have helped with that—with their preaching of a fearful, angry, petty, ugly God...a judgmental God; a punishing God. And in turning away from God, and God's love, we choose a substitute. We become enamored of our own selves alone and begin to see ourselves alone as our highest good. We wallow in our own power and misery, and we bury the forgotten love song of God deep down inside us where it still haunts us, even though we try to drown it out. And so we go begging for love from any other source than God, and the world we have created by our separation from God screams back to us that there is no God! For how could the world be as it is; how could we be as we are...if there were a God? If there were a "loving" God?

Is it any surprise that we find ourselves exactly where we are today? We are awash in troubles, living in a world in need of change, and yet afraid to surrender to our very present help in trouble and find our peace and our new life in God's cosmic love. Friends, this need not be!

And so today would be a good day to put down the phone, shut off the tv, and give some thought to the question: when IS the last time I felt God's love?

Today would be a good day to let go of a whole lot of things, to just LET GO, and have a good cry, or beat your fists against a wall, or shout and scream and get some of the garbage out of you so you can let some of God in you!

Today would be a good day to pray from your heart and start a real conversation with a real Presence who loves you, and is always here for you!

Today would be a good day to remember the last time you <u>did</u> feel God's love, and then hold onto that feeling as you remind yourself that *this* love is not to be feared, but cherished!

And today would be a good day to reclaim the core of our faith: God is love, and we are loved, and we are joined to God through our shared love... a love that will satisfy our restless hearts AND change this world into a place where love is cherished, honored, and welcomed!

May it be so, with God help! -Pastor Craig

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by the Moderator, Joyce Gelhaus in Fellowship Hall. Pastor Craig opened the meeting with a devotional and prayer. Wil Groves moved and Vicki Blaufuss seconded a motion that the minutes be approved as printed in the church newsletter. The motion passed. **Board and Committee Summaries:**

Treasurer's Report: July offerings exceeded expenses by about \$4,700.00. To date the offerings and expenses are in line with the budget. Tracy Wehrhan moved and Dale Olson seconded a motion that the report be put to audit. The motion passed. Finance Board: Scholarship Sunday was held on July 31. Board budgets are due September 15. A CD came due and was reinvested at a better interest rate. Christian Education: A reception was held for Hailey Brim after her confirmation on August 7, 2022. Rally Day is planned for September 11. Evangelism: No report. Mission: A check for the funds raised from the Brownie Sundae Drive-Thru was presented to Enhance Hamilton County. The funds will be matched and sent to the Food Pantry. Planning for the next Beacon of Hope meal is underway for the month of September. Pastor Eric and Annette Howard are no longer with the Beacon of Hope. The fixings for Brownie Sundays were delivered to Public Health personnel on August 4, 2022 as a gesture. Shelby Kroona said it was appreciated. Please see the Pastor's Report for information about the Angel Tree. Mission Board will discuss this at their next meeting. Fall clean-up and/or Climate Change Awareness will also be discussed. The wildflowers given out earlier this year are growing and attracting butterflies as intended. Relay for Life was held during Watermelon Days in Stanhope this year. It was poorly attended, which has prompted a meeting in August on whether to keep it or not. Staff/Parish: No report. Trustees: The church is being wired for Platinum Connect. Landscaping was done at a cost of \$1,203.00; an electric panel will be installed costing \$2,000. The nursery and Sunday school room need deep-cleaned. The sanctuary projectors need evaluated. The double doors at the main entrance were

difficult to open for the wedding. That door along with the NE, NW doors and the east door will need Sean

Moran to evaluate and repair. **Women's Fellowship:** The Women's Fellowship booklets are almost finished. **Worship:** Has not met for a couple of months. There are videos available for service when Pastor Craig is gone. **Pastor's Report:** Pastor Craig participated in the "Faith at the Fair" on July 24. Hailey Brim was confirmed on August 7 with a nice reception afterward. Pastor Craig will be in Burlington, lowa on August 14 and has prepared a video sermon for Sunday. The Chase Berhow / Carlee Yates wedding was held August 6 at UCC. WCMA Summer Lunch Program has ended and the Ministerium is receiving feedback, a discussion will follow. Rally Day is September 11 beginning at 9:00am. KLAB will begin again on Wednesday, September 14. Adult Education will resume Sunday, September 18 with a discussion of abortion. Regarding the Angel Tree – please see Pastor Craig's report below.

Old Business:

Constitution Committee: The committee is reviewing the changes/recommendations.

Emergency Plan: Pastor Craig put 4 video services together to use in case of his sudden absence. **New Business:**

Pastor Craig Update: Pastor Craig will be hospitalized for a lobectomy on August 26 September 19 and remain there for about 5-7 days to recover. MISSION BOARD Meeting held June 16, 2022

OLD BUSINESS <u>June Food Pantry</u>: Donations are still coming in. This is presently a good amount of donations. <u>Beacon of Hope</u>: Food for 35 people was prepared, but only 25 attended. The dish was well liked. Some deserts from the funeral were served. There were 4 servers. <u>Brownie Sundae Drive-thru:</u> We reviewed what was needed; mostly the pickle jar needed a sign. We felt we had enough volunteers to serve. Strengthen the Church: \$295 has been collected so far.

NEW BUSINESS <u>July Beacon of Hope meal</u>: Andrea M. volunteered to lead this. No date set until she confirms her work schedule. <u>Summer Lunch Program</u>: A survey went out to church members to gauge interest in providing meals for this program. No one expressed interest. The Church of Christ did a meal on June 6th and served 30. Asbury UMC is scheduled for the week of July 4 and the week of August 1. <u>Angel Tree Project</u>: This project has had several leads in the past and now, is this something the churches should take over. <u>Backpack Program</u>: Maybe will happen this fall. <u>Relay for Life</u>: will be held during Watermelon Days. There will be a lunch in the park for survivors.

Next meeting will be July 14, 2022 at 2:00pm.

MISSION BOARD Meeting held July 14, 2022

OLD BUSINESS Brownie Sundae: We raised \$1542.00. A check will be cut and presented to Darcy Swon to Enhance Hamilton County. EHC will match our donation. Food Drive: Enough donations were received for 13 compete birthday bags. They were delivered by Andrea Mosbach and Gayle Olson. NEW BUSINESS: July Beacon of Hope meal: All slots of the sign-up sheet are filled except for 1 cook. The meal will be cooked, delivered and served on July 27, 2022. Note: Annette and Eric Howard are no longer at Beacon of Hope. Hospital/Public Health Awareness: Discussion was held about who to recognize next in the community. The number of hospital personnel is a bit more than we can handle so we decided to treat the Public Health personnel with ice cream sundaes on August 4, 2022 at 2:00pm. Sherry will supply bowls, spoons and napkins; Gayle will do her jellyroll pan of brownies; Andrea will do blond brownies; I will do ice cream and Karin will deliver the treats. There approximately 19 employees. The Angel Tree: The Ministerium will be contacted by Kay Ross to see if the churches can sponsor the tree. Environmental: Discussed the possibility of a fall clean-up, a crop walk or butterfly garden and little forests for this fall. An environmental group called Goldilocks is in the process of forming so we may get ideas from them or cooperate with them on a project. Also discussed was possibly sponsoring replacement trees for the ash trees that are devastated by the ash borer. At this time, we don't know if the county or city is offering tree replacements. Lotus: The store has moved ½ block west of 2nd Street. There are apartments above the shop that are being rehabilitated. There may be something we could

help with. <u>ADVO Cats</u>: A new cat rescue facility has opened in town next to the Yes Way on 2nd Street. Eligible owners can bring cats for spaying and neutering at no cost.

Next meeting is August 11, 2022 at 2:pm at UCC.

Adult Ed – begins Sept 18 @ 9:00 A.M. A discussion was held on starting youth Sunday School. Pastor Craig will talk with potential teachers.

There will be no Confirmation class starting in the Fall.

PASTOR'S CABINET REPORTWorship: I participated in the "Faith at the Fair" ecumenical worship service on July 24 at 9:30am. 4 pastors shared short messages on the topic "Why Jesus?", and there were about 100 in attendance for that event. On August 7th we confirmed Hailey Brim, and it was a nice celebration. I will be absent August 14 in order to preach in my home church, and so that Sunday we will have a video sermon. I have also prepared 4 worship services with embedded video sermons to be used in case of my absence. Our last Saturday Evening service will be held August 27, and during that service I will baptize 3 of Maggie and Joel Kenney's children.

Wedding: Chase Berhow and Carlee Yates were married in our sanctuary August 6. This was our first church wedding sans our wedding coordinators but the bridal party took care of their own needs so all was well. Thanks to Gayle Olson for being our sound technician!

WCMA Summer Lunch Program update: The summer lunch program has now ended a week early as no one signed up to finish off the program. The number of attendees varied over the weeks; the WCMA will discuss the program and make decisions regarding its future.

Rally Day: Plans are afoot to hold another Rally Day the Sunday after Labor Day (Sept.11). We will start at 9 am in the vacant lot next to the church, with games for the kids. We will worship together at 10 a.m., the following worship we will enjoy a potluck meal!

Resuming CE Programming: KLAB will begin their fall programming on Thursday, September 15. This year we will divide into two smaller groups with the older students in one class led by Wil Groves, Patty Gescheidler, and myself and the younger in a class lead by Vicki and Susan Meinders. We will again ask for volunteers to bring in treats! Adult Ed will resume Sunday, September 18.

WCMA and the Angel Tree Program: a group of pastors and church reps met with Kay Ross of HERO who has been the lead coordinator of the Angel Tree Christmas Gift program. After considerable discussion the WCMA decided we would take this project over and divide the "angels" among Trinity ELCA, St Paul, Asbury UMC, Faith UMC, St Thomas, Webster City Church of Christ, and First Congregational. We anticipate at least 300 "angels", and the angels at each church are not intended to be taken only by church members—the public will be informed that these churches will have angels available for them to choose from. After discussion the decision was made not to include an income cap on the application in order to determine eligibility. Applications will be made available from Oct 1-Oct. 31. UDMO will handle processing the applications, and applications will be available at UDMO, Public Health, ACE and the Lutheran food pantries. Nov. 3 will be a work afternoon for the WCMA to make the angels for the trees; gifts will need to be back at the church where the tag was picked up from by Dec. 3, and gift pick up by angel families will be Sunday, Dec. 11 at the respective churches (afternoon). The Mission Board will shepherd this project at our church, but we will need volunteers to help!


